The association facilitates access to public and private funding and cooperates with like-minded organisations.

Bylaws

GREEN PHOENIX

Art. 1 – Name

Established under the name GREEN PHOENIX is an Association after the Swiss ZGB

Art. 2 – Location

The Association has its location in Basel, Canton BS. The Association can move its location with the agreement of the controlling authority within the borders of Switzerland at any time.

Art. 3 – Purpose of the Association

The purpose of this Association is the development of new models for communities of all forms, based on ethics, sustainable ecology and a fair economy for peace in the interest of the public. The basis is built on modern methods from pedagogy and health promotion in the broadest sense for the development of the individual and collective.

The activities of this Association serve this only purpose.

The Association is open to all interested parties and accepts network-membership as well as individual membership.

The Association serves an ideal purpose only with no goal to make profits. All capital of the Association is solely used for the purpose of the Association.

Should it be possible, the Association may support other institutions and persons, national or international, that serve a similar or same purpose.

Art. 4 – Capital and Finances

The Association supports itself through membership fees, donations, public support and income from own events.

The membership fees will be determined at the General Assembly meeting.

The accounts of the Associations will be balanced yearly on December 31.

Art. 5 – Bodies and Structure

Bodies of the Associations are

- a) the general assembly
- b) the board

c) the secretariat

d) the auditors

a) The General Assembly

The general assembly is the highest body of Association. The board is subordinate to the general assembly.

b) The Board

The board is made up of at least 3 members. It works for the general assembly, plans and oversees the activities of the secretariat and the work groups and the adherence with the purpose.

The period of office of the board is not limited, but has to be renewed yearly at the general assembly.

The board will suggest additions itself. They have to be confirmed by the general assembly. The board determines the authorities to sign.

Decisions will be made by consensus, or where necessary with majority of votes. With equality of votes the president of the board will decide with their vote.

Meetings can be held and decisions can be made via telecommunication.

All other bodies are subordinate to the board:

c) The Secretariat takes care of the coordination, delegation and the implementation of the projects and organizes the meetings of the board.

d) Auditors

The general assembly elects two auditors for the auditing of the accounts.

Art. 6 – Disposal of capital

Should the Association be terminated and should there be capital left, the general assembly will decide how it will be used, under the adherence of the Association's purpose.
